









The Rail Corridor Construction Course (RCCC) has been designed specifically for personnel entering the rail corridor with responsibilities for the planning, implementation and control of construction works, within the Metro Trains Melbourne's (MTM) operational network. This course development was sponsored by the Level Crossing Removal Project.

Course Description

- The RCCC identifies the critical risks associated with construction works in the rail corridor and channels the course participants to the specific areas of MTM's Safety Management System, where the Rail TO's risk mitigation controls reside.
- The RCCC has been structured as a "hands on course" where participants will spend a major part of their time in a simulated rail corridor activety assessing risks and controls relative to particular construction scenarios.
- The course has been designed to follow on from TTSA1 and SWIRC, and over time will continue to develop as MTM introduces modifications to work procedures.

- The participants attending the RCCC are given a clear and concise understanding of all the stakeholders within the MTM operational network and the criticality of considering all stakeholder requirements in the early planning stages of their works.
- The RCCC provides the participants with a working knowledge of the interface between themselves (Work Group Operators & Engineers) planning, implementing and controlling works and their interface to MTM's safe working systems, in particular the role of the TFPC (Track Force Protection Coordinator.)
- The RCCC will provide participants with a thorough understanding of their responsibilities regarding the process to gain access to the rail corridor, and the ongoing competency requirements for all rail safety workers carrying out construction works in the MTM operational network.









Course Delivery

The RCCC course has two modes of delivery:

- Instructor led workshop (1 day)
- · Recognition of Prior Experience

On successful completion of the course, candidates will be awarded a Certificate of Completion, provided electronically. This can be loaded to the individuals RIW card. Where candidates that have:

- a) Been assigned the RCCC competency by their RIW Training Administrator; and
- b) Provided their RIW details to Thomson Bridge,

Thomson Bridge will load their certificates directly to their RIW card.

Instructor led workshop

The instructor led workshop is held over 1 day at the Rail Academy Newport. The course is delivered as an interactive workshop, combining theory and practical elements.

Recognition of Prior Experience

Work Group Supervisors (WGS) and Project Engineers with a minimum of 3-years' experience may elect to pursue a Recognition of Prior Experience process.

The Recognition of Prior Experience process requires the candidate to identify 3 or more years' experience in the role of Work Group Supervisors (WGS) or Project Engineers, supported by a manager. This will be recorded on a form which is attached to the enrolment.

The form will be checked and verified, with experience subject to audit. Candidates without

the required 3 years will be referred back to the instructor led workshop.

Candidates with the required 3 years may then complete the RCCC assessment online via eLearning. Successful completion resulting in the award of the RCCC Certificate of Completion.

Unsuccessful candidates will be referred back to the Instructor led workshop.
